

#### Minister's Corner

#### In ALL CIRCUMSTANCES?

In the book *Robinson Crusoe* by Daniel Defoe, the protagonist who is shipwrecked on a desert island, creates two columns in his journal listing the "GOOD" and "BAD" of his situation. He is cast on a desolate island with no hope of rescue; but unlike his shipmates, he is alive. He is alone with no human support, but he has access to food from the destroyed ship. He has no clothes, but he is in a warm climate with no need of them. He has no means of defense, but no wild beasts threaten him. Crusoe concludes that in setting "the good against the evil," no worldly condition is so miserable that one cannot find something for which to be grateful.

In 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18, Paul writes, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." This might work for fictional characters like Crusoe, but are we in the real world really expected to give thanks in ALL CIRCUMSTANCES? How can we possibly give thanks for the loss of a loved one, a life-threatening diagnosis, a personal financial crisis, or a pandemic?

Eric Butterworth calls us to notice that Paul does not say, "for all circumstances butin all circumstances." No matter what shows up in the outer world, we realize the omnipresent Power, Presence, and Love of God in the midst of it. Because God is always present, goodness is always present. Time and time again, Jesus gave thanks before the good was manifested. In feeding the multitudes, he did not give thanks for hunger or for the lack of loaves and fishes. When raising Lazarus, he did not give thanks for the lack of life. Jesus looked beyond appearances to ever-present substance *in* all life. Like the fictional Robinson Crusoe, we can observe and accept the outward condition and use our perceiving power of faith to find the good outer conditions or to bring good to them. Discord, inequity, and COVID-19 are not the will of Good. The will of God is for our ever-unfolding good.

Paul gives us three, clear directives. In all circumstances, we can:

**Rejoice -**Turn away from victim, "poor-me" consciousness and joyfully claim all the powers of the Christ for ourselves and all humankind.

**Pray without Ceasing -** Consciously align in Oneness with God and all humankind, understanding that we are on this earth to express the Divine and to embrace infinite possibilities of good.

**Give thanks -** Show genuine appreciation for the allness of life, our joy and sorrow, laughter and tears, dreams and disappointments.

True gratitude, like prayer, is causative energy. Our co-founder Charles Fillmore wrote, "Pronounce every experience good and by that mental attitude, you will call forth only the good." Especially during this holiday season, we have the power to look beyond challenging circumstances to a Greater Reality. In *all* circumstances, an attitude of gratitude enriches our lives, uplifts others, and causes a global shift in consciousness. With grateful hearts, we envision a world awakened to infinite possibilities of love, compassion, and peace.


