

First Unity Videography Team: A Journey to the Heart of Service

In mid-March 2020, Rev. Jan announced that all gatherings at the church would be suspended until further notice, in keeping with the COVID-19 guidelines established by St. Louis County. Since we would be unable to attend church in person during that time, Rev. Jan was inspired to record an abbreviated service which would be delivered electronically, and the idea came to fruition as a handful of folks made arrangements to meet in the sanctuary on a Friday afternoon.

The service was to be recorded straight through on a cell phone attached to a tripod, and then uploaded to the Internet for viewing. Rev. Le Remington's talk for that Sunday was aptly entitled, "Finding a Safe Harbor in a Turbulent Sea". For a group of amateurs who had never done anything like this before, it felt as if something miraculous had occurred when the recording was accomplished without mishap. Nearly a year later, that very first recording has now been viewed 193 times!!

Over the following weeks, COVID restrictions remained in place, and the church stayed closed. During each of those weeks, a small group of folks met in the sanctuary to record another Sunday service. We encountered issues with lighting and sound inside the sanctuary; cell phones going off during the recordings; microphone and projector failures; airplanes flying overhead; issues with editing and uploading the videos...you name it! But through it all, we continued to forge ahead, knowing that our mission to send these messages out into the world is vital.

During that initial closure, we recorded services for twelve weeks, and then the church re-opened on June 14. Because many of our congregants were still unable to attend in person, the decision was made to continue recording and publishing Sunday services. At that time, a Videography Team was formed, and some changes were made to the recording process. Here, I would like

The church remained open for the next 23 weeks, and our team published a recorded service for each of those Sundays. Then, in late November 2020, COVID cases escalated and the church closed its doors again. So, we switched gears once more and reverted back to recording during the week in an empty sanctuary. As of this writing, 47 Sunday service videos have been published online, with a total number of viewings for all videos at nearly 4,000. Absolutely stupendous!!



Jeremiah Burcher, our Lighting and Sound Engineer, is a tremendous asset to our staff, and his efforts have made marked improvements in the quality of the recordings. Our thanks to Dennis and Patricia Riess, and to Carol Bullock for volunteering to join the videography team and for sharing their unique gifts and talents in service to our congregation. We would also like to thank Steve Schenkel for volunteering to be interim editor and publisher for our videos. And we can't forget Bob Leonard, who is always available to assist in whatever way he might be needed.

As videography team leader, it is my honor and privilege to work with this group of individuals. From a spiritual perspective, I have received at least as much as I have given. I have learned new skills, made stronger connections within the congregation, and acquired a new appreciation for working as part of a team dedicated to a greater purpose. I am grateful for the opportunity to serve in this way.

When installation of the new audio-visual system for the church is complete, this will allow us to live-stream in real time. Until we are ready to "flip the switch" and Go Live, the videography team will continue to record and publish Sunday services each week. It will be a grand celebration and a bittersweet end to the videography team's work at the same time.

It is our hope and prayer that these efforts are a blessing to the First Unity congregation, as well as to all those outside our community who seek connection with the Light and Love of God that surrounds and enfolds us all. We appreciate your love, support and encouragement around this endeavor and ask you to continue holding our team in prayer as we carry on with the work of this holy undertaking. The 12 Powers

Unity Co-Founder Charles Fillmore defined twelve fundamental powers of the Christ that compose our Divine Nature. It is part of our soul's evolution to awaken and utilize these powers, also called *faculties*, *gifts*, *abilities*, *attitudes*, *qualities*, and *freedoms*. Mr. Fillmore associated each power of the mind with one of Jesus' disciples, and he also correlated the powers with corresponding locations or nerve centers in the physical body. Later, colors were added to correspond to each power. Understanding these powers is the first step in activating them to enrich our lives.

Building on the work of Charles Fillmore as well as Julian Jaynes, Teilhard de Chardin, and Buckminster Fuller, Rev. Phillip presents the twelve powers as dyads in the chart.
