- °November 7, Robert Nelson, vocals with Eric Slaughter, guitar. Robert Nelson is one of St. Louis' busiest and most popular jazz singers. He is an extraordinary artist whose golden voice is a unique blend of standard jazz tones similar to Joe Williams and Johnny Hartman. Mr. Nelson writes, records, and performs music, and works as a consultant for the Heal the Arts Jazz Initiative. Eric Slaughter is one of the nation's finest jazz guitarists. He has worked with everyone from David Sanborn, Houston Person, and Donald Harrison to St. Louis legends Oliver Sain and Willie Akins.
- ° November 14, Kirk Hanser, classical guitar. Kirk Hanser is a stunning guitar virtuoso. Mr. Hanser has appeared throughout America and Europe as a soloist and ensemble member. Since 2002 he has directed the Mid-America Guitar Camp for young guitarists from around the U.S.
- ° November 21, Tim Mead, vocals and guitar. Guitarist and singer Tim Mead is one St. Louis' most active New Thought musicians. He regularly appears at Harmony Fellowship, The Mindful Spiritual Center, and Unity Church of Peace.
- ° November 24, Special Thanksgiving Eve Service, Brian Clarke, vocals and guitar. Brian Clarke is perhaps the most beloved New Thought musician in St. Louis. He is most recently the recipient of the *St. Louis Magazine* "A-List" Award as Best Vocalist and Best Musician. Yes, this is the same Brian Clarke who played at The Opera House / Train Wreck and Dorsett Inn. Brian has toured the U.S. many times as a bassist and vocalist with Kinky Friedman and Billy Swan. He has played with Willie Nelson, Jerry Jeff Walker, and many other well-known artists. As a solo performer, Brian has opened shows for The Little River Band, Poco, Leon Russell, David Crosby, The Outlaws, Tom Chapin, Donovan, and many others. Currently, Brian continues to confidently share the skills born of his tremendous experience. His stage presence is unique, spontaneous, fresh, alive, and of the moment. He connects with you. Brian works to see that you get exactly what he intends for you to have...a great time, every time!
- ° November 28, Kittie Moller, vocals with Vince Golomski, piano. The husband and wife

team of Kittie Moller and Vince Golomski has performed as "Fanfare" for 46 years, playing concerts across the globe. They are in constant demand for festivals, clubs, conventions, and educational events throughout the St. Louis area.

°December 5, Carolbeth True, piano with Glenn Smith, bass. Carolbeth True is perhaps the most significant St. Louis jazz pianist of the past 30 years. She is well-known in the St. Louis area as a performer and music educator. She is adjunct music faculty at Webster University and also has an extensive private piano studio. Carolbeth performs with Two Times True with her son Dave on drums; the Carolbeth Trio; the Oikos Ensemble; Wind of the Spirit Praise Band, and is an original cast member of "The Jazz Story", the first educational program presented by The Sheldon. Her trio enjoyed extended runs at both the Adam's Mark Hotel and Jazz at the Bistro. She has been the pianist with Variety Children's Theatre for nine years, and the All-State Vocal Jazz Ensemble for seven years. Her awards include "Excellence in the Arts" from the Arts and Education Council; Riverfront Times and St. Louis Magazine Best Jazz Artist among others. Carolbeth is heard on many CDs, most recently "True Christmas" with Two Times True. Glen Smith is one of the finest bass guitarists in the Midwest. He regularly plays with Carol Beth True, and he has for many years been the first-call electric bassist for the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra.

° December 12, Marcia Erwin, cello with Joe Neske, piano. Marcia Erwin is the principal cellist at the Fox Theater. She regularly plays for the Bach Society of St. Louis, St. Louis Winter Opera, and Union Avenue Opera. She attended Interlochen Arts Academy where she was principal cellist her senior year. While there she studied with Denis Brott of the Orford String Quartet. Ms. Erwin moved to St Louis to study with Yuan Tung on full

scholarship at the St Louis Conservatory of Music. At the Conservatory she participated in masterclasses with Yo-Yo Ma and Leslie Parnas and received extensive string quartet coaching by Michael Tree of the Guarneri Quartet. Ms. Erwin is formerly assistant principal of the Springfield Symphony Orchestra (Illinois Symphony Orchestra) and formerly principal cellist of the Webster University Symphony Orchestra. Ms. Erwin was the cellist of the Laclede Quartet for 19 years. She is currently a member of Opus38 Quartet, and the chamber groups Synergies and Trio Angelique. She also often performs with the St. Louis Municipal Opera, Winter Opera, the Repertory Theater of St. Louis, The Peabody Opera House Orchestra, and with area chamber music/choral groups such as The Masterworks Chorale. During his 20+ years as a St. Louis musician, Joe Neske has performed at the Fox, the Rep, the SLSO, the Muny (where he has participated in over 70 productions), and numerous other theatrical and educational venues. Joe also served as an adjunct professor at Webster University for 19 years, where he accompanied choirs and vocalists, taught classes in counterpoint, choral arranging, and music aesthetics directed the New Music Ensemble and provided individual instruction in solo and collaborative piano. He is a member of Musicians' Local 2-197.

- ° December 19, Christmas Candle Lighting Service, Deborah Sharn, vocals with Steve Schenkel, guitar. Deborah Sharn has been singing in St. Louis for many years and is a guest vocalist at various places of worship each Sunday. She is also an actress who has worked with the Black Rep, New Line Theatre, The New Jewish Theatre, and the Mustard Seed Theatre. Winner of two JUDY Awards, Deborah has performed her cabaret show, "An Evening With Deborah Sharn" several times at the Kranzberg Art Center to sold-out audiences. By day Deborah is the Company Manager for The Repertory Theatre of St. Louis. Steve Schenkel is the guitarist and orchestra manager for the Fox Theater, guitarist for the Muny Opera and the St. Louis Symphony, and a freelance jazz musician. He recently retired after 37 years at Webster University, where he founded the Jazz Studies program, the Webster Jazz Concert Series, and the Jazz Studies/Music Technology program.
- ° December 26, Terry Langerak, harp. Terry Langerak is a renowned harpist and recording artist in the St. Louis area. Ms Langerak serves on the faculty of the University of Missouri St. Louis and Maryville University.


