Minister's Corner



In All Things

On Nov. 28,1922, during a Sunday message, Unity Cofounder Charles Fillmore said, "Someone came up to me this week and asked me if we were going to have a Thanksgiving service. That surprised me because I see every service we have as a Thanksgiving service. Every service, every day, every moment we give thanks." As we approach the holiday season, most of us experience a heightened awareness of the power of gratitude, perhaps keeping a gratitude journal, sharing the blessings for which we are grateful at the Thanksgiving table and/or giving Christmas gifts to those who bless our lives. Because gratitude, like prayer, is causative energy, these practices lead us to even greater blessings. In New Thought, we teach that energy goes where our focus flows.

However, modern New Thought metaphysician Rev. Dr. Michael Beckwith tells us there are three layers of gratitude:

- 1. Gratitude for the good
- 2. Gratitude for the seemingly "not good"
- 3. Gratitude independent of circumstance

Paul wrote to the Thessalonians, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Give thanks *in all things?? Really?* Are we to give thanks for the pandemic, global warming, the war in Ukraine, and the serious illness of a loved one? That's a tall order! Unity legend Rev. Eric Butterworth reminds us this passage does not say *for* all things but *in* all things. Those life events we call challenges call us to activate our true potential. In the face of conflict, we ask, "What is this situation calling me to be?" *In all things* we understand that there can never be any place that God is not, and the Divine powers within us such as faith, strength and wisdom are greater than any problems in the outer world.

Finally, we learn to be grateful independent of circumstances. This has been called proactive gratitude, absolute appreciation, and authentic gratitude. It is a way of **being**, a deep inner knowing that our joy is not dependent on outer conditions, but from the consciousness of oneness with God through the indwelling Christ. Emilie Cady wrote, "Thanksgiving is the soul's recognition of its relationship with God." Gratitude is an inner state of mind that helps us awaken to our Divine nature and the understanding that we are always in Perfect, Creative Divine flow. Every day, every moment, we are grateful.

Thanksgiving and Christmas can be tender times for those of us who are facing loss or heartache. And yet, in the midst of challenges, we can always become still, turn within, and know that we are never alone. The Amazing Power we call God goes before us, strengthens us, and shows us the way. One with all the powers of the Christ, we prevail. In all things, we can find blessings.



by Don Miguel Ruiz



November 6 Brian Clark, vocals and guitar.



Brian Clarke is perhaps the most beloved New Thought musician in St. Louis. He is most recently the recipient of the St. Louis Magazine A-List Award as Best Vocalist and Musician.

Brian has toured the U.S. many times as a bassist and vocalist with Kinky Friedman and Billy Swan. He has played with Willie Nelson, Jerry Jeff Walker, and many other well-known artists. As a solo performer, Brian has opened shows for The Little River Band, Poco, Leon Russell, David Crosby, The Outlaws, Tom Chapin, Donovan, and many others.

Currently, Brian continues to confidently share the skills born from his tremendous experience. His stage presence is unique, spontaneous, fresh, alive, and of the moment. He connects with you. Brian works to see that you get exactly what he intends for you to have a great time, every time!

November 13 Kim Fuller, vocals, and Carolbeth True, piano.

Kim Fuller has been performing for decades in the St. Louis area. She began singing at age 5 in the Angel Choir at church. Over the years she has sung in a variety of music genres. She has been an opening act for the Jazz Crusaders, Randy Lewis, Pieces of a Dream, The Neville Brothers, and countless others. She is a member of The Jazz Story™, a group that promotes Jazz Education to grades K-12.

Kim is also a member of Oikos, a Jazz group that uses jazz as a catalyst to promote the gospel. She frequently performs around the St. Louis area with many talented musicians.

Carolbeth True is perhaps the most significant St. Louis jazz pianist of the past 30 years. She is well-known in the area as a performer and music educator. She is an adjunct music faculty



member at Webster University and also has an extensive private piano studio. Carolbeth performs with Two Times True with her son Dave on drums; the Carolbeth Trio; the Oikos Ensemble; Wind of the Spirit Praise Band, and is an original cast member of The Jazz Story, the first educational program presented by The Sheldon. Her trio enjoyed extended runs at both the Adam's Mark Hotel and Jazz at the Bistro.

Carolbeth has been the pianist with Variety Children's Theatre for nine years, and the All-State Vocal Jazz Ensemble for seven years. Her awards include Excellence in the Arts from the Arts and Education Council, Riverfront Times, and St. Louis Magazine Best Jazz Artist among others. Carolbeth is heard on many CDs, most recently *True Christmas* with Two Times True.

November 20 Dan Rubright, guitar and Ted Rubright, percussion.



Dan Rubright recently received a prestigious 2019 Arts Fellow grant from the St. Louis Regional Arts Commission for his work as a composer and leader in the arts. In addition to composing and performing, Dan leads a workshop called The Hidden Jazz of Teams.




Ted Rubright is a brilliant percussionist who has played with the Colorado Philharmonic, the St. Louis Symphony, the Opera Theater of St. Louis, and the Nuclear Percussion Ensemble.

Since 2009 he has been a member of the jazz/world music/fusion group The Wire Pilots with his brother, guitarist Dan Rubright. Mr. Rubright serves as an adjunct instructor of percussion at St. Louis University.

November 27 Kim Portnoy, piano and Steve Schenkel, guitar.



Kim Portnoy is recognized as a versatile composer of classical and jazz idioms. His compositions have been featured nationally and internationally at the Eastman Summer Trombone Institute in Rochester, New York; the Choral Music Experience Institute in Arvika, Sweden; the Guitar Foundation of America Conference at Oberlin Conservatory of Music in Ohio and two International Association of Jazz Educator™s conferences, New Orleans and Atlanta.



Steve Schenkel is the guitarist and orchestra manager for the Fox Theater, guitarist for the Muny Opera and the St. Louis Symphony, and a freelance jazz musician.

Steve has a Ph.D. in Music from Washington University and a Master's Degree in Religious Studies from Webster University where he has served as an Adjunct Professor of Religious Studies. Steve now serves as the Music Director for First Unity Church of St. Louis.

December 4 The Hanser-McLellan Guitar Duo



John McClellan and Kirk Hanser began performing together in 1996 while working to produce an international conference and competition in St. Louis, MO. Very quickly, Hanser and McClellan became known for their choice of entertaining musical programs, their technical prowess, and their ability to connect with audiences. Over the years, they have become recognized by critics and audiences

alike as one of the most enjoyable and highly respected American chamber music groups. The Hanser-McClellan Duo has been heard on several CDs, with their most recent feature recording, La Vida Breve, receiving much critical and audience acclaim. Classical Guitar Magazine (U.K.) declared their performance on this recording as exhibiting *sheer swagger and verve*. Most recently, John and Kirk recorded and produced tracks with Vince Gill, Tommy Emmanuel, Mark Knopfler (Dire Straits), the Los Angeles Guitar Quartet, and many, many others to create a CD celebrating the musical life of their dear friend, Chet Atkins, on the CD release Slightly Above Below Average.

December 18 Deborah Sharn, vocals and Steve Schenkel, guitar.




