PRECIOUS GIFTS

The fast-approaching Christmas season can be a time of joyful celebration. We might envision a Hallmark holiday -- a loving family gathering around a beautifully decorated Christmas tree as they gaze out the picture window to the unspoiled glistening snow, eagerly anticipating opening gifts that will be perfect in every way. But what about the pressure in finding the perfect gift for everyone on our list? What about all the holiday preparations -- the planning, shopping, wrapping, baking, decorating? It may seem like just too much! One of my friends called me one year on Dec. 22 and said, "I'll be so glad when Christmas is over! Next year, I'm taking the whole family on a cruise. It would probably be cheaper & I would be far less exhausted."

In the book *How to Let God Help You*, Unity Co-founder Myrtle Fillmore cautions against overdoing at Christmas. She writes, "It would be more in conformity with the Christ Spirit to use the time in sending out to our family and friends the joyful thoughts that come spontaneously from the Christ love." Decades later, the great American philosopher, The

Grinch, decided, "Maybe Christmas doesn't come from a store. Maybe Christmas means a whole lot more.'

The Advent season is a time of preparation, but it is about more than decorating and giftgiving. It's a time for us to rejoice in the ancient story of the birth of Jesus, and it's a time to celebrate the rebirth of our own indwelling Christ Nature. This is the season for us to claim and share those gifts that are the most precious of all – the inner gifts of FAITH. PEACE. LOVE. and JOY:

FAITH

True faith is one of our 12 spiritual powers, a deep inner knowing that there is a Reality beyond our physical senses. We look beyond illness to wholeness, beyond lack to abundance, beyond fear to faith. Faith moves mountains.

PEACE

Jesus calmed the raging storm by saying "Peace, be still!" When we pause, breathe, turn within, and become still, we align in Divine Peace – the peace that passes all understanding. As our hearts are filled with peace, the world is transformed.

LOVE

Love has been called the master power, the power that attracts us to our good. Christ Love is our nature. We look for every opportunity to be God's love in expression. Love rulest

Joy is truly a gift of spirit. It enables us to see the best in every situation and to be grateful for what happens in our lives. Through joy, we celebrate that God is All and God is in all situations.

My Christmas wish for everyone in our blessed spiritual community and beyond is expressed in this Christmas prayer adapted from James Dillet Freeman:

> May there always be room in your heart for divinity to find a birthing place. May you be holy as the angels. faithful as the shepherds. humble as the cattle. wise as the Wise Men.

May you have the compassion of Mary and the understanding of Joseph. and may the blessings of the Christ child be yours, not because of a birth night long ago. but because Christ love is born in you today!

Joy Unspeakable by Lynn Mark

From a recent online Meditation comes a quote by Dr. Barbara Holmes, found in her book, Joy Unspeakable. Dr. Holmes is a spiritual teacher, activist, writer and scholar focused on African American spirituality, mysticism, cosmology and culture. She is a frequent contributor for Father Richard Rohr's Center for Action and Contemplation. Although he is a Catholic priest, Unity ministers often refer to him as one of them because his outlook is so aligned with Unity teachings.

Dr. Holmes writes: "When you least expect it, during the most mundane daily tasks, a shift of focus occurs. This shift bends us toward the universe, a cosmos of soul and spirit, bone and flesh, which constantly reaches toward divinity. Ecclesial organizations want to control access to this milieu but cannot. The only divisions between the sacred and the secular are in the minds of those who believe in and reinforce the split..."

After reading that and thinking about it for a few minutes I thought about the occasions when I get a sense of great joy. They happen, as she says when I least expect them. Suddenly it occurred to me that we are going into the fall and early winter season in the next few months. I felt a sense of gratitude for what the season will bring - Halloween, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. That accumulation of experiences brings me a big serving of happy when I think of the opportunities they bring.

Last week I was walking out of the building where US Immigration Services is located. At my side were two clients and we were all smiling like there was no tomorrow. We had just accomplished something life changing for them. As we were walking, I stopped and declared, "I'm so happy for you that I can hardly stand it!". We all paused together and had a group hug. My client is overjoyed because our next step is to bring her two young sons here from the Philippines. Anyone walking past us would have felt the gratitude and anticipation emanating from the three of us.

Another time, in Santa Fe, I was driving down Cerillos Road which is not always the happiest road due to traffic congestion. It was almost dusk and the sun was casting an orange glow on to the Sangre de Cristo mountains. I noticed that and felt a jolt of joy. "I get to live here and witness this!" is what went through my mind. There were many occasions in Santa Fe where the very landscape made me feel blessed to be a part of it. And, like Dr. Holmes wrote, it often happened when least expected. I feel this same way at the edge of an ocean, or in the presence of the Grand Canyon, or in a gathering of good friends. I often feel this way when I am in the company of fellow Unity people.

Thank you, Dr. Holmes, for writing words of wisdom and sharing them and reminding me that sacred spaces and sacred times will manifest even when I'm not paying attention.


November 12 Samuel Huddleston, vocals and Steve Schenkel, guitar.



November 26 Colleen Stumbo, harp.




